Federally Funded Research in Missouri

Federal funding for scientific research reaches every state in the nation. See the impact of funding to organizations in Missouri from three of the major government research agencies:

National Institutes of Health:

In FY2016, organizations in Missouri received 1,158 awards from NIH, across all of its institutes, totaling \$508,984,218.

National Science Foundation:

In FY2016, organizations in Missouri received 250 awards from NSF, across all of its programs, totaling \$68,084,000.

Department of Energy Office of Science:

In 2015, educational organizations in Missouri received research awards from the DOE office of Science worth \$14,168,787.

Companies Created from Research in Missouri

Nanova Inc, founded by University of Missouri professors Dr. Hao Li and Dr. Qingsong Yu in 2006, recently agreed to terms with the Chinese venture capital firm Summitview Capital in 2013. The company, developed with assistance from the MU University Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship, will produce bioabsorbable bone screws, coronary stents, and new dental health products based on the company's core nanomaterial technology.
