Federally Funded Research in New Hampshire

Federal funding for scientific research reaches every state in the nation. See the impact of funding to organizations in New Hampshire from three of the major government research agencies:

National Institutes of Health:

In FY2016, organizations in <u>New Hampshire</u> received 211 awards from NIH, across all of its institutes, totaling \$98,857,889.

National Science Foundation:

In FY2016, organizations in <u>New Hampshire</u> received 124 awards from NSF, across all of its programs, totaling \$42,532,000.

Department of Energy Office of Science:

In 2015, educational organizations in <u>New</u> <u>Hampshire</u> received research awards from the DOE office of Science worth \$2,074,000.

Companies Created from Research in New Hampshire

<u>Glycofi</u>, founded in 2000 by Dartmouth Professors Tillman Gerngross and Charles Hutchinson, engineers strains of yeast to perform controlled glycosylation. The company was acquired by Merck in 2006 and continues to operate in Lebanon, NH with more than 60 employees.

ImmuNext, founded in 2010, is dedicated to developing novel therapeutics that modulate the immune system to treat cancer and autoimmune diseases. Using founder, and Dartmouth medical professor, Dr. Randolph Noelle's research the company aims to produce new molecules to achieve disease remission.
